Assistant Principal Message

End of term Child Protection and safety lessons

As always at Rosary Park we revisit our safety and child protection lessons at the end of each term before the holidays. Teachers will be providing the opportunity for students to identify safe people in their home circle, as well as safe behaviours when in the community. If you would like to have these conversations in your home, you may find the following resources helpful.

Kids Helpline online - https://kidshelpline.com.au/kids

The Kids Helpline website has an abundance of child friendly fact sheets and videos to support all areas of child and adolescent wellbeing and mental health. The resources are sorted into age ranges to ensure your child can access quality age-appropriate materials.

Road Safety - https://www.safetytown.com.au/

The Safety Town website is a NSW State Government initiative and has resources for students, parents and teachers. It has government videos and fact sheets about helping to keep your children safe as a passenger and pedestrian. Games and quizzes help to engage students in safety messages about bike safety and simple road rules.

Holiday Learning

Don't forget to keep learning during the holiday break. There are many simple ways to continue the learning for your child/children during the holidays. Never underestimate the impact of participating in simple learning games and activities with your child/children. One of the most valuable things you can do with your child/children is to read with them. Not only does this build their vocabulary, but also their oral language and comprehension.

For younger children

• Identify numbers and letters/words in the environment when driving in the car, walking around town or at the shops

- Play karaoke let children read the words and sing, this builds graphological or picture (what a word looks like) knowledge to assist reading and spelling
- Build multiplication knowledge identify grids or arrays in the environment how many rows and how many columns
- Cook together talk about mass the meaning of kg, g, I, ml etc
- Use adjectives (describing words) to describe some objects in nature who can think of the most describing words
- If you must watch something on a screen, turn on subtitles for more exposure to print
- Count down the days of the holidays on a calendar
- Use an analogue clock to identify bedtime, bath time etc Where is the big hand? What does it mean when the big hand is on 6? etc
- Categorise objects using various criteria eg. Size, shape, colour, manmade/natural
- Use items in the environment to create an artwork

For older children

- Estimate the total of a group of objects in the trolley
- Calculate the cost of a day out movie tickets plus the cost of lunch for the whole family etc
- Cook together double or halve the ingredients in a recipe to allow for more/less people
- Read the instructions to a new game
- Read a book with your child you read left hand pages, and they read the right
- Design an outdoor obstacle course and time how long it takes to complete the activities can you get faster over the holidays?
- Use a calendar
- Tell the time on an analogue clock

As we come to the end of the year, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for entrusting Rosary Park with the education of your children. I feel blessed to have the opportunity to work with so many wonderful families and children every day.

To those leaving our community, I wish you every happiness for the future, may you always remember the lessons and values you've been taught at Rosary Park and for those returning next year, I look forward to working with you again in 2025.

I wish you all a safe, happy and holy Christmas time. I hope you have the chance to spend some quality time with your family and friends.

Congratulations to Samantha R and Jaxon C for their excellent results in the 2024 ICAS competition, resulting in an invite to the ICAS All Stars Competition!

The ICAS All-Stars competition is a chance for students to push their academic boundaries, gain recognition at the state level, and be rewarded for their hard work. It's more than a competition it's a celebration of excellence and a pathway to greater academic achievement. Students must qualify for the competition by completing the ICAS assessments at their school and achieving a Merit or above!

The ICAS All-Stars competition features three assessment tiers designed to match the academic abilities of participants based on their 2025 school year level:

- Junior Assessment: Years 3, 4, and 5
- Intermediate Assessment: Years 6, 7, and 8
- Senior Assessment: Years 9, 10, 11, and 12

Participants will have the opportunity to earn prestigious titles and generous prizes:

- ICAS State Champion: The top scorer in each year level per state will win \$500.
- **Top Tier Scorer**: The highest scorer in each assessment tier (Junior, Intermediate, Senior) per state will receive \$1,000.
- **Dual Honours**: Students achieving the highest score for both their year level and assessment tier will win \$1,500.
- **Participation Award**: All competitors will receive a digital certificate celebrating their achievement.

Prizes are awarded as Mastercard eGift vouchers, allowing students to use them for educational or personal growth opportunities.

Over the past 2 weeks, our two Virtual Academy students had the chance to present their Semester 2 learnings at the 2024 Virtual Academy Showcase. The showcase was a chance for students to share their research and showcase their creativity and critical thinking skills.
